The need for a transition toward a more sustainable food system maximizing environmental, health, and social benefits while supporting economic growth is therefore particularly needed. To foster this transition, countries are asked to orient their policy interventions in agriculture to improve their response to societal demands on food and health, including safe, nutritious, and sustainable food. Agricultural policies need to adapt to the current challenges, which leads to two relevant and related research gaps. Empirical evidence on the fitness and suitability of traditional measures and interventions in agriculture in achieving the expected outcomes and impact is particularly limited with regard to novel expectations and requests. The latter requires a better understanding of farm responses, of farmers' willingness and capacity to adhere to the policy measures, and how these might impact the environmental and economic farming dimensions. Secondly, the need for the development of new methodologies and tools to analyze and deeply understand the impact of policy decisions on the novel spheres has been accelerated. The Special Issue aims to include both empirical research articles and conceptual pieces covering (but not limited to) all stages of the agri-food system, from production to distribution, marketing, and consumption, which may contribute to develop an evidence base for rural development policies and interventions to address novel, emerging societal problems in both developed and developing countries. The European Rural Development Policy and, specifically, the LEADER Approach, are key tools in the endogenous, local, participatory and sustainable development of the rural environment and in its planning as an inhabited territory withneeds. Throughout its 30-year history, they have been rethought several times, with 2021–2027, according to the usual community operation, being the sixth programming period. During all these stages, the importance and repercussions of the method for the European rural environment and for those territories that have taken it as an example, are unquestionable, and perhaps even more so today due to the demographic and socioeconomic reality faced by the different entities and public administrations that manage the funds.

We are interested in papers that study and investigate, both from theoretical and normative points of view as well as quantitative and statistical, the history of the Rural Development Policy and LEADER from its character of "community initiative" with specific funds assigned by the European Commission for each State Member until its consolidation, in 2007, as an axis of action of the EAFRD (European Agricultural and Rural Development Fund). In addition, it is necessary to investigate the new approaches for the future period 2021–2027 and the implementation of similar models in other regions of the world, that is, the future of public action policies designed to achieve greater and better rural development and not only at the European level, but also in other rural territories with the same needs, even more so in the current context of clear political and economic uncertainty.

We consider this an important multidisciplinary problem in which numerous researchers are involved. We encourage authors to submit contributions in the following priority areas to this Special Issue of Sustainability:

Strategies with which to alleviate the demographic and socioeconomic problems of the rural environment and to contribute to sustainable land use planning.

New models of sustainable rural development for land use planning.

Recent rural dynamics are primarily characterized by three interrelated trends: economic diversification, deagrarianization, and depopulation; the first two of which common to all rural areas. It is true that deagrarianization and the simultaneous shift towards a service economy in present-day rural economies and societies have not led to the disappearance of rural space but instead some rural areas are presenting extraordinary territorial and economic transformation. These comprise zones that fall between the countryside and the city where intensive rural urbanization or peri-urbanization processes are taking place. In the past, primary sector activities were very important, but their importance has steadily declined in both absolute and relative. Agricultural activity has become relatively unimportant as urban activities and functions acquire greater prominence. This has substantially weakened and modified agricultural activities and transformed land use patterns in rural regions. Nevertheless, in recent decades, agricultural activities had received new functions in peri-urban areas. As a common factor of all them, the acknowledgment of biodiversity and heritage values in the agricultural uses and the compatibility of both with quality food production. These concepts include eco-system services, peri-urban agricultural parks or home market agriculture, and urban productive landscapes. Land use policy, especially legal regulations relating to construction land supply, are critical tools to harness territorial development. The policy trajectory of construction land supply entails a complicated reconfiguration of public functions, which is driven by rural-urban relations. The integrated urban-rural development should be raised through the experimentation of a new use policy and land management. Many unanswered questions remain regarding the impacts of urbanization on rural areas. Contributions to this Special Issue could serve to provide some answers. We invite papers that link countryside urbanization, deagrarianization, land management, land use planning, urban sprawl into rural areas, and integrated rural-urban development.
